## SOME REMARKS & CONCLUSIONS

- LOOK AT YOUR DATA (!) WE OVERRELY ON STATISTICS WITHOUT TAKING THE TIME TO UNDERSTAND OUR DATA
- THERE ARE NO METHODOLOGICAL GUIDELINES FOR RATINGS
- WE DON'T REALLY KNOW HOW TO INTERPRET RELIABILITY METRICS (ICC, SPLIT-HALF CORRELATION, CRONBACH'S ALPHA, ...) AND HOW RELIABLE THEY ARE
- SOME RECENT LARGE-SCALE DATASETS ARE, AT BEST, VERY NOISY DUE TO A LOW SAMPLE SIZE (~10 OBS/ITEM)
- THE RESULTS OF A LARGE NUMBER OF STUDIES (ESPECIALLY fMRI) ARE QUESTIONABLE DUE TO UNRELIABLE RATINGS AND INADEQUATE STIMULUS SAMPLING & STATISTICAL MODELING
